- <u>Dismantle beds and ensure that</u> all parts are present
- For safety, we cannot gift incomplete cots and beds.
 - <u>Label all parts accordingly, e.g.</u>
 'Part I of 5'
- > <u>Labelling parts helps us to keep items</u> together and prevents loss.
 - All loose parts, bolts & screws provided and securely attached
 - Beds should reference the following safety standard somewhere on the product – EN7/6
 - Ensure no part of the item is broken
- > For safety, we cannot give out any broken items; even one broken part makes the whole bed unusable.
 - No DIY repairs
 - Ensure item is age appropriate
- > We support families with children aged under 5, so cannot use or store beds for older children/adults.
 - Include item instructions
- > Assembly and safety instructions are very useful to our team and to families. If you do not have the original but are able to locate a copy online and print, it is appreciated.
 - Wash all used bedding and do not donate stained items
- > Our items are gifts; we cannot gift stained items for reasons of hygiene and dignity.
